## **THE COLLECT**

Almighty God,  
you have broken the tyranny of sin  
and have sent the Spirit of your Son into our hearts  
whereby we call you Father:  
give us grace to dedicate our freedom to your service,  
that we and all creation may be brought  
to the glorious liberty of the children of God;  
through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord,  
who is alive and reigns with you,  
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,  
one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

## **FIRST READING**

### **A Reading from the letter to the Romans**

How can we who died to sin go on living in it? Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so

that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.

For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin. For whoever has died is freed from sin. But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. The death he died, he died to sin, once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

## GOSPEL READING

### A reading from the Gospel of St Matthew

'A disciple is not above the teacher, nor a slave above the master; it is enough for the disciple to be like the teacher, and the slave like the master. If they have called the master of the house Beelzebul, how much more will they malign those of his household!

'So have no fear of them; for nothing is covered up that will not be uncovered, and nothing secret that will not become known. What I say to you in the dark, tell in the light; and what you hear whispered, proclaim from the housetops. Do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell. Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? Yet not one of them will fall to the ground unperceived by your Father. And even the hairs of your head are all counted. So do not be afraid; you are of more value than many sparrows.

## PRESENTATION OF THE CANDIDATES

*After the sermon, the president invites Kit to the font with his parents, godparents and sponsors.*

*The president addresses the whole congregation:*

Jesus said, 'Let the children come to me. Do not stop them'.

We thank God for Kit who has come to be baptized today. Christ welcomes him into his Church.

So I ask you all:

Will you support Kit as he begins his journey of faith? **We will.**

Will you help him to live and grow within God's family? **We will.**

## THE DECISION

*The president addresses Kit through his parents, godparents and sponsors:*

We all wander far from God and lose our way:

Christ comes to find us and welcomes us home.

In baptism we respond to his call. Therefore I ask:

Do you turn away from sin? **I do.**

Do you reject evil? **I do.**

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour? **I do.**

Do you trust in him as Lord? **I do.**

## **SIGNING WITH THE CROSS**

*The president makes the sign of the cross on Kit's forehead.*

Christ claims you for his own.  
Receive the sign of his cross.

Do not be ashamed of Christ. You are his for ever.  
**Stand bravely with him against all the powers of evil,  
and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.**

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness,  
and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. **Amen.**

## **PRAYER OVER THE WATER**

Praise God who made heaven and earth,  
**who keeps his promise for ever.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.  
**It is right to give thanks and praise.**

We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water  
to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life.  
Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation.  
Through water you led the children of Israel  
from slavery in Egypt to freedom in the Promised Land.  
In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John  
and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ,  
to lead us from the death of sin to newness of life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism.  
In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection.  
Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit.  
Therefore, in joyful obedience to your Son,  
we baptise into his fellowship those who come to him in faith.

Now sanctify this water that, by the power of your Holy Spirit,  
they may be cleansed from sin and born again.  
Renewed in your image, may they walk by the light of faith  
and continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord;  
to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be all honour and glory,  
now and for ever. **Amen.**

## **PROFESSION OF FAITH**

Let us affirm, together with Kit  
our common faith in Jesus Christ.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father,  
source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist?

**I believe and trust in him.**

Do you believe and trust in God the Son,  
who took our human nature, died for us and rose again?

**I believe and trust in him.**

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit,  
who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in the world?

**I believe and trust in him.**

This is the faith of the Church.

**This is our faith.**

**We believe and trust in one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.**

## **BAPTISM**

Kit Cameron, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son,  
and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

May God, who has received you by baptism into his Church,  
pour upon you the riches of his grace,  
that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people  
you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit,  
and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory. **Amen.**

We have brought Kit to baptism knowing that Jesus died and rose again  
for him and trusting in the promise that God hears and answers prayer. We  
have prayed that in Jesus Christ he will know the forgiveness of his sins and the  
new life of the Spirit.

As he grows, he will need the help and encouragement of the Christian  
community, so that he may learn to know God in public worship and private  
prayer, follow Jesus Christ in the life of faith, serve his neighbours after the  
example of Christ, and in due course come to confirmation.

As part of the Church of Christ, we all have a duty to support him by prayer,  
example and teaching. As his parents and godparents, you have the prime

responsibility for guiding and helping him. This is a demanding task for which you will need the help and grace of God. Therefore let us now pray for grace in guiding him in the way of faith.

God of grace and life,  
in your love you have given us a place among your people;  
keep us faithful to our baptism, and prepare us for that glorious day  
when the whole creation will be made perfect  
in your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

*The president sprinkles holy water on the people in reminder of their baptism.*  
May the God of love and power  
forgive you and free you from your sins,  
heal and strengthen you by his Spirit,  
and raise you to new life in Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

## THE WELCOME

There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism: Kit by one Spirit we are all baptized into one body.

**We welcome you into the fellowship of faith;  
we are children of the same heavenly Father; we welcome you.**
